This <i>non-invasive</i> imaging test allows Dr. Abundo to see a much more detailed view of the retina than with traditional methods. The image becomes a permanent part of your medical file, allowing Dr. Abundo to make important comparisons year over year. In many cases, there will not be a need to dilate after this process. If Dr. Abundo decides that there is a need for dilation, this will be discussed during your exam.
These images will help see early signs of many retinal diseases and systemic conditions such as <i>glaucoma</i> , <i>age related macular degeneration</i> , <i>high blood pressure</i> , <i>diabetes</i> , <i>retinal holes or detachments and retinal tumors</i>
The discounted \$35 co-pay for this procedure is generally a non-covered service unless being used to actively follow ocular disease. Any questions you have about the optomap® Retinal Exam can be directed to your doctor during your examination. Dr. Abundo strongly believes that either traditional dilation OR the optomap® Retinal Exam is an essential part of your comprehensive eye exam and prescribes it for all patients once per year.
